The best views of Berlin's Film Festival

Incidentally, the views from here are also stellar outside the Berlinale as well, with breathtaking panoramas from the Marlene-Dietrich-Platz square to the Berlin TV Tower and - towards the west - the spreading Tiergarten Park and the Victory Column.

When the flashlight parade of movie stars has passed, you'll also have more time for culture in other forms. The renowned Philharmonic Hall, for example, is within easy walking distance of the Grand Hyatt Berlin. Moreover, it is also the hotel's official partner - and so the Concierge can even find you a ticket for sell-out concerts. The entire district around the hotel is also flourishing culturally. In the direct vicinity, the Cultural Forum, which includes the New National Gallery, the Museum of Decorative Arts and the New State Library, is a special magnet for heritage and culture fans. Not so keen on classical music and paintings? Then check out the contemporary art in little pop-up galleries in the neighbouring Potsdamer Straße - or explore what's cooking in some of the city's hottest up-and-coming restaurants. Without anyone hardly noticing, this vibrant street has transformed itself into one of the hippest places in town. And no one really knows when it happened!

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
