Out and About in Berlin

Berlin's system of buses, U-Bahn (subway) and S-Bahn (city railway) provide accessible mobility around the city. BVG (Berlin public transport services) buses all offer step-free access, with space for wheelchairs, wheeled walkers, prams and buggies. BVG personnel are happy to assist you into the buses and trains.

Unique in Europe: The VBB (Verkehrsverbund Berlin-Brandenburg) transport association offers an assistance service. If required, an accompanying person is provided for passengers on BVG buses and trains or the S-Bahn (city railway). The service is available for people who use wheelchairs just as much as the elderly, those travelling with prams or buggies, and people with limited mobility, walking disabilities or visual impairments. > vbb.de/begleitservice

Great things to do in Berlin

Berlin has a wealth of diverse attractions – and here are just some of them!

The Reichstag's wheelchair accessible glass dome has a fantastic view out across the city (advance registration required: "visit the dome" bundestag.de/en/visittheBundestag). The Bundestag Visitors' Service also offers special tours of the plenary chamber for people with a visual impairment.

On the cultural front, Schloss Schönhausen (Schönhausen Palace) provides audio guides for people with a visual impairment and video guides with sign language.

In Madame Tussauds™, you can meet and greet over 120 life-size wax figures of famous historic figures, sporting heroes, pop stars and Hollywood legends. Sounds like selfie time!

The popular Quatsch Comedy Club* is located in the Kleine Revue stage in the glitzy Friedrichstadt-Palast theatre. On English comedy nights, local club comedians join guests from London and New York to give a laugh-out-loud take on life!



Relax to the max at the end of the day. Visit the Liquidrom*, float in warm salt-water with underwater music, and enjoy the sauna and spa facilities.

Discover Green Berlin

Berlin is unique – with a stunning array of green spaces. The innumerable parks and gardens, large and small, all feed the city's soul (and lungs!), and offer a wealth of charming corners to relax.

With its never-ending array of lawns, flowerbeds and paths, the spreading grounds of the Gärten der Welt* (Gardens of the World) in the Marzahn Recreational Park are dedicated to styles of landscaping from across the world. For this year's International Garden Show (IGA) Berlin 2017, the Gardens of the World have been connected with adjacent sites to create a vast and attractive park – well worth a visit whatever the season!

In Berlin, you can also explore one of the world's loveliest Botanic Gardens. The city's famous Botanischer Garten (Botanic Garden) presents the diversity of plants in its popular Fragrance and Touch Garden, while the magic of east Asian plants can be enjoyed at any time of year.



Enjoy vast open spaces in the heart of Berlin. The Tempelhofer Feld park is always a popular destination for a day out!



A Day in Berlin

On this tour, discover some of most popular places in the dynamic districts of Kreuzberg and Neukölln – and take in Potsdamer Platz on the way!

The tour starts at the Admiralbrücke bridge in Kreuzberg. Take the path by the water along to the Café Ahorn 1 where you can enjoy a delicious snack or hearty breakfast. The next stop is Potsdamer Platz. There, Europe's fastest lift is waiting to whisk you 100 metres up to the Panoramapunkt 2 with its breathtaking views of the city. The Martin-Gropius-Bau (Major special exhibitions) 3, one of Berlin's most renowned arts venues, is close by. Its programme of exciting changing exhibitions ranges from the classic to avant-garde in art, cultural history, photography and archaeology.

Back in Kreuzberg, recharge your batteries at Die Weltküche (World Cuisine) 4. As its name says, here you can enjoy home-made cuisine from across the world.

Then follow Gräfestraße south to the attractive Hasenheide park. Past the mini golf and petting zoo, you'll find the main entrance to Tempelhofer Feld park 3 across the Columbiadamm boulevard. On the vast site of the decommissioned Tempelhof airport, enjoy the incredible space in the heart of the city or take a tour of the former main building.

The tour continues in the up-and-coming Schiller neighbourhood. At Herrfurthplatz, stop off at Mo's Eisley 6 – and indulge in the delicious ice cream and vegan sorbets. From here, take the U-Bahn (subway) to the Rathaus Neukölln station. Then it's off to one of Berlin's most unusual bars – the Klunkerkranich 7 on the roof of the Neukölln Arcaden shopping mall! Here, you can relax and enjoy the view, a drink and a snack. This unique bar high above the city roofs is also a venue for laid-back music, events and actions.

For an evening meal, try the tasty Mexican-French-German cuisine at the Koyote restaurant 3 close to the Admiralsbrücke bridge. And to round off the day, head for the Südblock 9 event location for a concert or a reading.

This suggested tour was provided by Wheelmap. The interactive online Wheelmap finds places that are wheelchair accessible. Wheelmap.org was founded in 2010 and is a SOZIALHELDEN project.





In the rococo Ephraim-Palais, the Stadtmuseum Berlin presents special exhibitions on the history and culture of Berlin. The guides are trained so that people who use wheelchairs or have walking disabilities can join any tour.

The Bode-Museum showcases sculpture and art works from the early Middle Ages to the late eighteenth century, and is home to the Museum of Byzantine Art. > smb.museum

In a wealth of interactive exhibits, the DDR Museum (GDR Museum) presents the many facets of life in the former East Germany. > ddr-museum.de/en

The Gemäldegalerie (Old Master Paintings) boasts one of the world's leading collections of European paintings from the thirteenth to the eighteenth century. > smb.museum

The me Collectors Room exhibition space shows one of the most comprehensive private art collections in Europe, with works from the early sixteenth century to the present day. > me-berlin.com

The Villa Oppenheim houses the Charlottenburg-Wilmersdorf Museum with its focus on regional and everyday life in the district, as well as Berlin's cultural history.

The Neues Museum (New Museum) presents masterpieces from the Egyptian Museum collections and sculptures from the Classical Antiquities Collection. Highlights include the bust of Nefertiti and the Bronze Age "Berlin Gold Hat". > smb.museum

In its multimedia exhibition "Discover what moves us", the Ottobock Science Center Berlin explains how our bodies work and showcases innovative products for improving the mobility of people with disabilities.

The Topographie des Terrors (Topography of Terror) Documentation Centre is built on the former site of the Gestapo and SS headquarters. With its permanent exhibition and historic site tour, this is among Berlin's most visited sites of remembrance. Audio guides and an app with sign language commentary are available. The exhibition areas are all wheelchair accessible. > topographie.de/en

The first Deutsches Spionagemuseum (German Spy Museum) offers an exciting interactive exhibition on the shadowy world of espionage and secret services, past and present.

In the baroque Zeughaus (Armoury), the Deutsches Historisches Museum (German Historical Museum) (DHM) presents 2,000 years of German history in permanent and temporary exhibitions. The exhibition areas are all wheelchair accessible. Public tours are offered once a month for visually impaired and blind visitors. > dhm.de

The Nikolaikirche (Nicolai Church) is Berlin's oldest surviving building and a highlight of regional architecture. Today a museum, it focuses on Berlin, church and architectural history. People who use wheelchairs or with walking disabilities can join any of the tours. Audio guides and multimedia stations available.


