




### Do residents enjoy living in Berlin?

■ (generally) agree



85% of residents are proud that people from across the world visit 'their' city.




- (generally) proud

85 % of residents believe that Berliners are good hosts.





Nearly 75% of all Berliners see the growth in tourism as advantageous for residents over the next years.





82% of Berliners neither feel restricted nor disturbed by tourists.




- (generally) not restricted / not disturbed

# Restrictions or disturbances? The mood in the main tourist hotspots

Residents in Mitte, Friedrichshain and Kreuzberg feel more disturbed by tourists than the residents in Neukölln.








### Restrictions or disturbances?

#### The mood in the other districts

Residents in, e.g., Wilmersdorf and Zehlendorf do not feel bothered by tourists – while residents tend to in Treptow, Wedding, Lichtenberg, Weißensee and Pankow.








#### Restrictions or disturbances?

## **About the survey**

Commissioned	Berlin Tourismus & Kongress GmbH/visitBerlin
Parent Population	Residents in private households in Berlin over 14 yrs old
Sample	Random sample from the ADM Master Sample, Representative random sample in multi-person households, total = $n = 3.00$
Method	Computer-assisted telephone interviewing (CATI)
Weighting	Population representation weighting by age, gender, size of household, district and education
Field time	17 May – 2 August 2017
