The green sides of the city



59% of Berlin comprises **green spaces** – an area larger than the city of Cologne.



2.500 parks and green spaces to enjoy.



Even Goethe once sat in the shade of the **900-year-old** „Dicke Marie“, Berlin's oldest tree.

430,000 streetside trees
a breath of fresh air.



At a height of **115 m**, Berlin's highest hill* is the Große Müggelberg in the Köpenick Müggelberg hills.



Over **7.000** bee colonies supply many urban beekeepers with honey.



The green urban jungle:
15,775 hectares of woodland covering $\frac{1}{5}$ of Berlin's urban space, an area larger than the city of Bonn.

5.847 hectares of water

or **6.6%** of Berlin's city area. Combined, this would create a lake large enough to cover the boroughs of Mitte (39.5 km²) and Friedrichshain-Kreuzberg (20.4 km²).



Around **80** lakes and bathing lakes – well worth a visit any time of the year.



With **39** official bathing sites across the city, summer fun is guaranteed.



Berlin has over **50** islands in its many lakes and the Spree and Havel rivers.

UNESCO World Heritage

Berlin's largest lake is the Müggelsee in Treptow-Köpenick.

960 bridges – more than twice as many as in Venice.


Little Venice

Berlin boasts two Venices – one on the Havel and the other on the Müggelspree.




