The Christmas markets that are opening this week include those at Potsdamer Platz, Gendarmenmarkt, Gedaechtniskirche and Charlottenburg Castle. Between the concert hall and the German and French cathedrals, numerous artists display their unusual crafts such as flax embroidery or wood sculpture.

The Lucia Christmas market set in the historic surroundings of the Kulturbrauerei radiates a Scandinavian atmosphere. Alongside some 40 stalls from Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway and Sweden are pine and log fires. The absolute highlight on cold days is so-called jacket heating, an art project with a warming effect.

If you are looking for unusual Christmas gifts, you should have a look around the Berlin designer markets. Aspiring fashion designers, designers and graphic artists present their work during the four weekends before Christmas at the Trendmafia Designer Christmas market at Hackesche Quartier. The Alte Muenze Berlin opens its doors on the weekend of 3 and 4 December for the annual "Holy.Shit.Shopping" experience. Every year, this market brings together the best of Berlin's young design scene.
